



ALTERNATIVE DRESS DAYS

There are special days set aside throughout the year when students do not have to wear uniform clothing. These days are scheduled several times per year and have a specific purpose. The details and dress guidelines are outlined below:

SPIRIT DAY

Spirit Days occur approximately once per quarter and are set aside to recognize the sports teams that are currently in season. Students gather in the gym for an assembly near the end of the school day to celebrate the teams. Students are allowed and encouraged to show their school spirit by dressing in school colors – green and gold.

General dress guidelines for Spirit Day include:

- TCS Team jerseys
- TCS T-shirts
- Socks in TCS colors
- Headbands, hats, face paint, etc.
- Lower School students must wear uniform bottoms
- Middle School students may wear jeans

CASUAL DAY

Casual Days are set aside as occasions when students may dress out of school uniform. Approximately 4 times per year these days are deemed “casual” days where students pay \$1 to dress out of uniform. The proceeds go toward a designated charity or non-profit organization. Students, parents or teachers may nominate the receiving organization.

General Casual Day dress guidelines include:

- Non-uniform clothing permitted but must fall within the parameters listed below:
 - Torn, ripped or frayed clothing are not permitted
 - Length of short/skort must be no shorter than 3” above the knee
 - Sleeveless shirts or shirts that expose the midriff are not permitted
 - Hats are not permitted
 - Shirts may not have inappropriate language, slogans or pictures
 - Boots are allowed on casual dress days
