VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR ARIZONA FIRST LEGO LEAGUE, FIRST TECH CHALLENGE, AND FIRST ROBOTICS COMPETITION EVENTS

The CocoNuts FIRST Robotics Team of Coconino High School will be hosting and sponsoring numerous FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology) events throughout Arizona and New Mexico for the 2015/2016 season.

The CocoNuts will host FIRST Lego League host the Flagstaff FIRST Lego League Tournament on December 5 and travel to support the Winslow FIRST Lego League Tournament November 14. The CocoNuts will also volunteer at the Arizona FIRST Lego League Championship at Arizona State University December 12.

The CocoNuts will sponsor six FIRST Tech Challenge Qualifying Tournaments in Flagstaff, Chandler, Phoenix, Tucson, Goodyear, and Albuquerque. The CocoNuts will host the Arizona FIRST Tech Challenge Championship in February in Flagstaff. The AstroNuts FTC team will be the host team for the Flagstaff Qualifier.

We're not talking trash – we're cleaning it up! In the 2015 *FIRST** LEGO League TRASH TREKSM Challenge, more than 233,000 children ages 9 to 16* from over 80 countries will explore the fascinating world of trash. From collection, to sorting, to smart production and reuse, there is more to your trash than meets the eye. Join *FIRST* LEGO League teams on a Trash Trek to discover the hidden (or not so hidden) world of trash!

The 2015/16 FIRST Tech Challenge game, FIRST® RES-QSM, is modeled after actual rescue situations faced by mountain explorers all over the globe. Played by two Alliances of two robots each, robots will score points by: "resetting" Rescue beacons; delivering Rescue Climbers to a shelter; parking on the mountain; and parking in the Rescue beacon repair zone or floor goal. Robots may also score points by retrieving debris from the playing field and placing them in mountain or floor goals, and also by hanging from a pull-up bar during the last 30-seconds of a match.

Volunteers are needed for technical roles, such as referees, judges, and robot inspectors as well as non-technical roles such as queuing, pit administration, and registration.
