Our Itinerary – September 2016

Pre-Tour Days: Monday and Tuesday, September 12 and 13 - You are free to make travel arrangements as you choose. We recommend arriving in Scotland at least a day ahead of the tour. You could fly out of the US on Monday, arriving Scotland Tuesday. *This does not form part of the tour and is not included in the tour price.*

- Day 1: Wednesday, September 14 Welcome to Scotland! Your tour manager will meet you in Edinburgh after breakfast. With our party assembled we drive to Glasgow and have a brief tour of this fine city. We visit Glasgow Cathedral where we begin to understand early Celtic influences and the far reaching effects of the Reformation. We also pause there for a service of welcome a short act of worship in the celtic tradition. Lunch is provided for us and we spend a little time in the beautiful Kelvingrove Art Gallery and Museum (includes Dali's *Christ of St. John of the Cross*). We head out of the city, taking a scenic drive by Loch Lomond you will quickly see why they sing about the "Bonnie, bonnie banks". Arriving in the west coast port of Oban, we catch the ferry to Mull (the crossing takes about 45 minutes) and a short drive then brings us to the delightful village of Tobermory where we'll spend the next two nights. A fine dinner and a good night's sleep awaits.... *Meals included lunch, dinner Overnight: Western Isles Hotel, Tobermory, Isle of Mull*
- Day 2: Thursday, September 15 Iona: A Thin Place We drive by the single track roads to Fionnphort where another short ferry ride brings us to Iona, a very special island. It was here in the year 563 that St Columba arrived, establishing the Christian faith in this land. In the language of Celtic spirituality Iona is sometimes described as a "thin place" where the veil between earth and heaven is at its most transparent. We visit the Abbey and learn about Columba. We also hear about the Iona Community. Beauty, tranquility, spirituality....a wonderful day! We return to Tobermory for the night.

 Meals included breakfast, lunch, dinner Overnight: Western Isles Hotel, Tobermory, Isle of Mull
- Day 3: Friday, September 16 The Great Glen and Inverness Back to the mainland this morning. From Oban we head north into Scotland's majestic highlands. We make a stop at Glen Coe an incredibly beautiful place but also the site of an infamous event in this nation's history. A distillery visit is on the program. Then we travel up the Great Glen. At Loch Ness we keep a lookout for monstrous events from our vantage point at Urquhart Castle. Inverness the "Capital of the Highlands" is tonight's destination. You can stroll along the banks of the river from our city center hotel and find a place of your own choice for dinner. *Meals included breakfast Overnight: Palace Hotel, Inverness*
- Day 4: Saturday, September 17 I will lift mine eyes unto the hills.... We begin our day with a visit to the excellent Culloden Battlefield Center, learning about Bonnie Prince Charlie and the Jacobites. Driving south we make a stop to ride the Cairngorm Mountain Railway. This ingenious funicular takes us all the way to the top where can enjoy breathtaking views and have lunch. By late afternoon we are in Perth ("The Fair City") where we'll have a guided tour of St John's Kirk it was here that John Knox preached the sermon which set light to the Reformation in Scotland. Then on to Dundee, another city with a proud history, arriving at our hotel in time for dinner it begins with a haggis ceremony and you can taste a little of this delicacy. Meals included breakfast, dinner Overnight: Apex City Quay Hotel & Spa, Dundee
- Day 5: Sunday, September 18 St. Andrews the "Auld Grey Toon" The charming little town of St Andrews is only half an hour from Dundee via the Tay Bridge. We'll share in morning worship with a Church of Scotland congregation there. After lunch one of our excellent professional guides will lead a walking tour. St Andrews boasts Scotland's oldest university where many of the Kirk's ministers have been educated. It is a significant site for the history of the Reformation. We see the castle and cathedral ruins. There will also be free time to browse in the stores or maybe walk along the West Sands. Golfers can look longingly at the Old Course. If time permits today we may see a litle more of the lovely "East Neuk" of Fife. A group dinner will be provided and we'll meet for evening prayers before driving back to Dundee. Meals included breakfast, dinner Overnight: Apex City Quay Hotel & Spa, Dundee
- Day 6: Monday, September 19 Edinburgh The Athens of the North From the cobbled streets of its Old Town to the Georgian grandeur of the New Town, Edinburgh is a truly beautiful city full of history and full of life. Today we'll have an orientation to Scotland's capital. Our guide will walk us among the medieval streets and will also explain much about modern living in this vibrant city. We visit Edinburgh Castle. We see Greyfriars Kirk and hear about the Covenanters. And we end the afternoon in the very modern buildings of the Scottish Parliament. The evening is free for you to choose dinner in one of Edinburgh's many eating places. *Meals included breakfast Overnight Jury's Inn, Edinburgh City Center*
- Day 7: Tuesday, September 20 A Little More Edinburgh Our last full day together has arrived too soon you will want to return to Scotland! We visit John Knox' House in the Royal Mile. Then we take a tour in St Giles Cathedral (sometimes called the "mother church of Presbyterianism") and we share in the noon prayer service led by one of the ministers there. You are then free to go to lunch and spend the afternoon as you wish. Perhaps visiting Holyrood Palace appeals to you. Perhaps you want to spend the time more quietly, enjoying a coffee or doing a little souvenir shopping. Tonight we have our closing time of worship and a special celebration dinner.

Meals included – breakfast, celebration dinner Overnight – Jury's Inn, Edinburgh City Center

Day 8: Wednesday, September 21 - Departures
