Traumatic Brain Injury in Veterans: Clinical Implications, Tools, & Research

Tuesday, June 7, 2016 | Johns Hopkins University, Montgomery County Campus | 9:00 am — 4:00 pm

Seminar Summary | According to Brainline Military, “Each year there are a reported 1.7 million civilian brain injuries in the United States. In the military from 2000 through 2012, more than 266,000 service members sustained a [Traumatic Brain Injury] TBI.” Over the last decade, both Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and TBI have become known as the ‘signature wounds’ of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. Still, there is much more to learn about the long term effects that TBI has over the course of a person’s life. This seminar will describe the different types of TBI and common comorbid conditions including PTSD, examine the rates of TBI in the military and veteran population, and explore the assessment and management of TBI in various settings.

Additionally, this program will address the overlapping conditions of TBI and PTSD, the utility of new technologies such as virtual reality and smart phone applications, and the current state of research on TBI such as the NeuroDRIVE study.

Seminar Speakers

Jeffrey Mann, Psy.D., is a Subject Matter Expert within the Military Training Programs division and a faculty member at the Center for Deployment Psychology (CDP), at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS) in Bethesda, Maryland. In this role, Dr. Mann serves as an instructor and facilitator for the training programs offered by the CDP. Dr. Mann is a veteran of the United States Air Force (USAF) where he served as a psychologist from 2009 to 2013. In 2013, he deployed to Southwest Asia in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. Dr. Mann's clinical work has focused on the assessment and treatment of trauma-related mental health conditions, the utilization of brief interventions in primary care, and behavioral management of pain and insomnia.

Michael Roy, MD, Col. (Ret.) is a professor of Medicine, Director of the Division of Military Internal Medicine at Uniformed Services University and Director of Recruitment for USU's Center for Neuroscience and Regenerative Medicine. He is a graduate of Brown University and Brown University School of Medicine. Dr. Roy completed an internal medicine residency and a general medicine fellowship at Walter Reed Army Medical Center, and retired as a Colonel after 24 years' of active duty in the Army. He is President of the Society for Brain Mapping and Therapeutics and a fellow of the American College of Physicians. Dr. Roy is currently the principal investigator on multiple active studies seeking to improve the early identification and treatment of post traumatic stress and traumatic brain injury.

Shawn Nelson Schmitt, Ph.D., is a Neuropsychology postdoctoral fellow in the Ettenhofer Laboratory for Neurocognitive Research at USUHS and a licensed clinical psychologist in Maryland. He received his Ph.D. from the APA-accredited Clinical Psychology program at Gallaudet University. Dr. Nelson Schmitt completed his APA-accredited clinical internship in the Neuropsychology Track at the Alpert Medical School of Brown University. At Brown, he evaluated veterans and civilians for symptoms of dementia, psychiatric conditions, and chronic medical illnesses with diverse and underserved populations. In addition to his research work, Dr. Nelson Schmitt conducts clinical neuropsychological assessments with active-duty military service members with traumatic brain injury, stroke, or other conditions.

From North 270, take Shady Grove Road exit. Once on the exit ramp, stay in the left lane. At the light make a left onto Shady Grove Road. Proceed to Key West Avenue. Turn right at Key West Avenue. Make a left onto Broschart Road. The Montgomery County Campus will be your first left turn. **Do not park in the parking garage, which is for National Cancer Institute employees only.**

Take I-70 west to Md. Route 97 (Georgia Avenue). Turn left on Md. Route 97. Go south on Md. Route 97 to Norbeck Road (Md. Route 28). Turn right onto Norbeck Road. Continue west on Norbeck Road to East Gude Drive. Turn right onto East Gude Drive and proceed 4.3 miles across Rockville Pike to Key West Avenue. Bear right onto Key West Avenue (Md. Route 28). Cross Shady Grove Road, stay to the left and proceed about .3 miles. Make a left onto Broschart Road. The Montgomery County Campus will be your first left turn. The 9601 building is in the middle of the three buildings. There is very little parking in the front, but there is plenty of parking in back of all three buildings and to the side of the 9605 building. **Click here for further information on parking and directions.** **Do not park in the parking garage, which is for National Cancer Institute employees only.**
