

Fourth edition of Doha GOALS Forum to be held in Los Angeles, July 25-27 Global sports forum will partner with Special Olympics for 2015

(Doha, Qatar, April 2015): The fourth edition of **Doha GOALS**, the world's leading platform focusing on sport as a driver of social and economic change, will be held in <u>Los Angeles</u> from <u>July 25-27 2015</u>. Doha GOALS Forum will partner with **Special Olympics** this year for the three-day summit and legacy programme.

The 2015 edition Forum will debate topics such as women and young people in sport, philanthropy and CSR initiatives featuring sport, and sport's role in promoting inclusion in society.

The summit will be held during the week of the 2015 Special Olympics World Games in Los Angeles – the first time the Forum has been held outside Qatar.

Doha GOALS is a **call to action** for policymakers, NGOs, corporations and athletes alike. **H.E. Sheikh Faisal bin Mubarak Al Thani**, Executive Director of Doha GOALS, said: "This year, we have chosen to partner with the Special Olympics, the world's most wide-reaching organization focusing on sport for development, especially to the most marginalized people on earth – people with intellectual disabilities. Our partnership will go beyond a presence at the World Games, and will cover initiatives to last year-round to promote sport as a tool for creating a more inclusive society."

Executive producer **Richard Attias** added: "After three years, we are very proud to bring the Doha GOALS Forum to America. The Forum is truly becoming a platform for dialogue, providing inspiration for years to come."

A number of initiatives have been created through Doha GOALS in the past 24 months, including a program to build sports fields in disadvantaged communities and a prosthetics program backed by Paralympic champions.

Janet Froetscher, Chief Executive Officer of the Special Olympics, said: "We have spent more than four decades proving to the world that sport has the power to transform lives and communities. We are delighted to partner with the Doha GOALS Forum this year: it is a platform that brings together global decision-makers with a clear agenda to act and make impact. The backdrop of our World Games offers the perfect opportunity for leaders to see first-hand the immediate and positive impact sport can have and the lasting legacy it can bring to creating an inclusive and respectful society."

To date, the Doha GOALS Forum has brought together more than 5,000 participants from 70 countries to discuss how sport can be used to solve some of the world's greatest social and economic challenges.

With 7,000 athletes and 3,000 coaches representing 177 countries, along with 30,000 volunteers and an anticipated 500,000 spectators, the 2015 Special Olympics World Games - being staged in Los Angeles July 25 - August 2, 2015 - will be the largest sports and humanitarian event anywhere in the world in 2015, and the single biggest event in Los Angeles since the 1984 Olympic Games.
