




In a nutshell...

How You Can Help at Home

- Remain positive with your children about the test. Fear and dread don't help at all!
- Read with your child, and question them about their reading.
 - Citing evidence
 - If your child says, "I think Frank was brave.", ask, "Can you show me two places in the book where it said something that made you think he was brave?
