Summer Day Camp Instructor

Essential Responsibilities

Duties may include, but are not limited to the following:

- Leading classroom and field lessons for camp programming
- Leading games
- Supervising campers in the Museum and on walking field trips
- Developing and delivering activities during summer camp aftercare programs.
- Identify and respond to camper behavior issues.
- Know and understand ALL emergency procedures associated with the camp program.
- Performing related duties and responsibilities as required.

QUALIFICATIONS

Education:

Pursuing a degree in education or science or have a Bachelor's degree in education or science

Physical Conditions:

Essential and marginal functions may require maintaining physical condition necessary for standing or sitting for extended periods and moderate lifting. The position requires the need to lift items weighing up to 40 pounds.

Knowledge of:

- Camp, youth programs, recreation, working with children, or in a related field.
- Leading, planning, organizing, and implementing program activities.
- Strong organizational and communication skills.

Licenses:

Possession of a valid California driver's license and a satisfactory driving record.
