Since first becoming accredited in 1999, the Industrial Machine Technology Program continues to offer national, industry credentials to students and, having earned eight NIMS credentials for himself, instructor Dale Miller continues to lead by example.

The renewal review process includes a comprehensive self-evaluation that is validated through a rigorous on-site evaluation, which occurred on March 13, 2015 and was led by NIMS Evaluator Kurt Heinly of [Teleflex](#). Kurt issued above-average ratings in several areas of the evaluation and, in combination with the program's self-evaluation and other criteria, NIMS Director of Accreditation Catherine Ross issued the renewal on May 6, 2015 and this national accreditation is valid for the next five years.
