



## **THE WILLIAM J. HUNTER SCHOLARSHIP**

The family of James and Mary LaTorre Greenlees has established a scholarship program to recognize and honor the dedication and commitment of long-time Lopez English instructor, William J. Hunter. The beloved Mr. Hunter taught at Father Lopez Catholic High School for 28 years, retiring in 2012.

During his tenure at Lopez, Mr. Hunter had a positive and enormous impact on many of his students. He coined the phrase, “Lopez Works”, to express the overall success the school had in educating the whole person.

The Hunter Scholarship is a two-part award, recognizing both a graduating senior and a Lopez faculty or staff member who had a positive and enormous impact on the student. The scholarship will provide:

- A \$1,000 award to a graduating Lopez senior to be used for college; and,
- A \$1,000 award to the Lopez faculty or staff member acknowledged by the Lopez senior.

Any currently enrolled senior student in good standing is eligible to apply. The award recipient will be one who is working to his or her full potential and plans to attend a college or university in the following school year. The application deadline is Tuesday, **March 31, 2015**.

Applicants are requested to write a 200-300 word essay on the following topic: **“Please identify a member of the Lopez faculty or staff who has had a positive and enormous impact on your life and explain why you feel that way.”**

Please be sure that your name appears at the bottom of your essay. Submit your essay to the Guidance Office by the March 31 deadline.
