Possibilities of development, willingness, ambition and educational opportunities were also on display by our ambitious youth. Kwesi was a contestant judge for SKILLSUSA Massachusetts and was also fortunate enough to see demonstrations in food prep, facial demonstrations, faux techniques aging leather, creating a sketch for 3D design, how to use proper protective equipment, the operation of delay on electricity, a 3 way switch technique and halogen versus HID headlights presentation along with a CPR demonstration. Other demonstrations included measuring volume in a biotechnology laboratory, culinary arts, health assisting, carpentry, engineering, graphics, business education, biotechnology, early education & care, media, computer science, automotive technology, information technology and creative design.
