The Office of Management and Budget (OMB) has a new set of rules for organizations accepting federal grants and awards. They're called the *Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards*. Most people just call them the Uniform Guidance (UG).

Auditors everywhere are updating and changing their methodologies to make sure that testing procedures take the UG into account.
