130,000 Holocaust survivors live in the U.S.



25% live in poverty

and struggle to afford housing, food, health care, transportation, and meaningful human interaction.

AJFCA VISTA Project members assist the largest communities of survivors in the United States including New York, New Jersey, Detroit, Chicago, Los Angeles, Southern Florida and metro D.C.

Participation in the VISTA project has impacted entire communities and Holocaust survivors across the U.S. since its inception in September, 2014

2,515 uninsured or economically disadvantaged Holocaust survivors were impacted by the VISTA project



the VISTA project leveraged \$475,562 in in-kind donations

including volunteer time, food and space and raffle prizes for socialization events, pro bono dental services and eyeglasses, and food baskets for survivors in need.

7 agencies conducted community needs assessments, including a national scan for legal needs. 94 organizations contributed to a greater understanding the needs of survivors in project commuities and across the United States
