Connecting young adults with developmental disabilities to our community – since 2009 this has been the goal of the Gary Shupin Independent Living Community. Today Shupin House, its residential arm, is at full capacity, providing its five residents a welcoming community and the personalized support to promote maximum independence. The Shupin Social Club brings together young adults from throughout San Francisco and beyond, providing a warm environment and the personalized support that enables adults with developmental disabilities to socialize and practice independent living skills. Innovative activities have included cooking and music classes, celebrations of Hanukkah, Purim, and Rosh Hashanah, Passover, and Tu BiShvat seders, community service opportunities, and activities such as gardening, picnics, movies and cultural events, karaoke, and bowling. Educational programs empower residents and encourage social skill development and practice. The Shupin Social Club has developed a solid core of twenty to thirty active participants. Parents report that the program provides an important social outlet to increase participants' sense of independence and develop their independent living skills. The program is currently being expanded to include case management and independent living skills training, and replicated across the counties we serve to address the critical unmet needs of its target population.

Total program or production cost if applicable and funding sources: The cost for the current programming is approximately \$200,000 and is sustained by a mix of participant fees, grants, and donations. Significant program expansion is planned with additional resources.
