What is SCOPE of Pain?

SCOPE of Pain is designed to help you safely and competently manage patients with chronic pain, when appropriate, with opioid analgesics. The case-based program covers the following content: decide on appropriateness of opioid analgesics; assess for opioid misuse risk; counsel patients on opioid safety, risks and benefits; monitor patients for benefit and harm; decide on continuing, modifying or discontinuing opioid analgesics; and discontinue opioids when there is too little benefit or too much risk. In addition to detailed clinical content, participants in live activities engage in an intensive question-and-answer session with video trigger tapes illustrating complex patient-provide communications.

SCOPE of Pain is sponsored by Boston University School of Medicine. The Cape Cod meetings are a collaboration with Cape Cod Healthcare and the Barnstable County Regional Substance Abuse Council. National collaborators include the Council of Medical Specialty Societies and the Federation of State Medical Boards.
