Committee Passes Intermunicipal Cooperation Agreement

In mid-2015 the GLOW Region Solid Waste Management Committee passed and sent to its funding counties for approval, its Fourteenth Amended and Restated Intermunicipal Cooperation Agreement (IMA). By the end of August all three counties had approved and signed the agreement. The agreement governs GLOW's operation.

The organization, started in October of 1987, was funded by Genesee, Livingston, Orleans and Wyoming (hence the

"GLOW") counties. Orleans County left at tion and Recycling (MWR&R) grant and the end of 2003.

The GLOW Committee is comprised of county planners and legislators that meet every other month. The Genesee County Treasurer is GLOW's Fiscal Officer. GLOW's finances are handled by Genesee County under direction of the Committee. Funding is from county contributions that total \$72,000 per year and are based on population, and grants received through DEC's Municipal Waste ReducHousehold Hazardous Waste grant programs.

The new two year agreement runs from January 1, 2016 until December 31, 2017. At the conclusion of this agreement GLOW will mark 30 years of providing waste reduction, recycling, reuse, composting and hazardous waste programs and education to all sectors of the three (3) counties.
