If you are interested in the SAT review class for the May 7 exam, we will have the registration process in Spring, 2016. We are unsure if we will run the May 7 exam class in the AM, PM or both.

SAT information

Dates and Times

Days and times of our review classes for the March 5th SAT test: the March classes will begin on Monday, January 11th and end Friday, March 4th. We are planning on holding review classes 4 days a week. The 0 period classes will be 7:50 – 8:40 on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Fridays with the Thursday morning class being 8:30 – 9:25. The afternoon classes will be from 3:20 – 4:10, Monday through Thursday. On weeks with holidays we may adjust the schedule to avoid losing instructional time.

Credits

Students can earn 2 credits for taking this class. We anticipate that few students will request this option because the only student needing these credits would be those who need additional credits for high school graduation. This would be rare for a student who considering going to a 4-year college.

Work Load

The value of this class and the increasing of a student's potential score will be directly related to the amount of effort that they put forth. Students will be asked to take a Verbal or Math practice exam on 6 separate weekends. In addition they will have worksheets of actual SAT questions that they will be asked to do 3 days a week. With few students seeking Credits, all work will be optional yet essential if students are to find this class valuable.

Other Information

The class is intended for juniors though all students are welcome. If a student were to take it as a sophomore and wish to repeat it as junior they would find that we are using the same practice worksheets. It is likely that practice tests would be identical as well unless the College Board releases more exams.

The instructors will be Gregg Whitnah and Jen Payne for math and Liane Strub and Shannon Kirkpatrick for verbal. Regardless of the instructor all materials and lessons will be identical.
