Eastlake PTSA Scholarships

\$1,000 Katherine Siddoway Scholarship (2 offered) – Eastlake High School's founding principal, Katherine Siddoway, had a vision for schools to recognize that all students are gifted and talented. Under her leadership, EHS became a "student-centered community of learners in which each person had dignity and intrinsic worth." Ms. Siddoway built on students' strengths to prepare them to make responsible choices as contributing members of the global community.

2016 Community Service Awards (2 per grade level) – EHS PTSA strongly values community service. The PTSA will award two (2) Community Service Awards to students in each grade level who have made outstanding contributions to the Eastlake and/or Sammamish community.

- Seniors award recipients: A \$1000 scholarship (\$900 to be applied to future academic endeavors and \$100 to be donated to the charity of his/her choice).
- Freshman, sophomore, and junior award recipients: A certificate of award that can be used in their college portfolio. They can also reapply as seniors for the financial award.

\$1000 Marty O'Connor Athletic Scholarship (1 offered) -Marty O'Connor was involved in EHS cross country, track and basketball to support not only his children but all athletes. This scholarship honors Marty's passion for sports and his understanding of the value sports can play in the lives of those who participate in them.

\$1,000 Officer Stan Chapin "180 Degree" Scholarship (1 offered) - Officer Stan Chapin, a longtime Resource Officer at Inglewood Junior High and Eastlake High School, was a beacon of light for all students, especially those facing hard times during high school. This scholarship honors his dedication to supporting students and helping them find the strength to overcome their challenges. The EHS PTSA will award the scholarship to a recipient who has demonstrated a turnaround in his or her life and overcome adversity with a positive attitude, integrity, and concern for others, along with movement toward meeting educational and personal goals.
