# Peace & Justice Committee Minutes March 14, 2016

- 1. Brook opened by praying the prayer of Justice, Psalm 7. Vonetta shared a reflection written by her husband, Jason.

### 3. Recruitment

- a. Brook has had no success recruiting committee members from the Reading area

- 8. Brook shared about the upcoming Assembly on April 16 where the focus will be on the Israel-Palestine conflict. Conference leaders will hear the perspective of a Palestinian man, discuss theology that impacts the conflict, and will hear about ways that ACC congregations are involved in the region.

  - a. Learning Tours
    - i. Israel-Palestine Tour September
    - ii. Us Mexican Border May & October
    - iii. Native American Tour tentatively planned for September
  - b. Ecumenical Advocacy Days conference held in Washington DC April 15-18
    - i. Focus this year is on racism, class, power
    - ii. Scholarships are available to young adults see Curtis Book for more details
  - c. MCC is still exploring the possibility of opening an advocacy office in Harrisburg, PA
  - d. Syria Crisis Response MCC is encouraging congregations to remain involved in the crisis response. Material aid and donations are dwindling, but these are what often influence people to stay in the region rather than seeking safety externally as a refugee.

    - i. 5 year anniversary of the Syrian Civil War Tuesday, March 15, 2016
    - ii. Immigration: the New Sanctuary Movement is seeking Menno support for a PA law to make drivers licenses available to illegal immigrants
    - iii. Bring Pastor Max Home online petition and advocacy effort to return this Iowa Pastor from deportation to Honduras
    - iv. Sentencing Reform and Corrections Act
      - 1. Reduces some mandatory minimum sentences
      - 2. Allows work release for nonviolent offenses
