# The Rides

Monday, Sept. 7 — Day 1 Ride, 10:00 A.M.—12 noon rolling start from the Armstrong Hotel

Horsetooth Reservoir and about town — 45 miles, 2,112 feet ascent/descent

- End of ride stop at New Belgium Brewing
- Dinner at Armstrong Hotel

#### Tuesday, Sept. 8 — Day 2 Ride

Greeley by way of Poudre River Trail—70 Miles, 1,200 feet ascent/descent

- Lunch provided at Weld County Fairgrounds (turn around point)
- End-of-ride stop at Odell's Brewing Company
- Dinner at Coopersmith's, Old Town Fort Collins

### Wednesday, Sept, 9 — Day 3 Ride

Loveland, Carter Lake, Masonville, Horsetooth Res. - 57 miles, 2,600 feet ascent/descent

- End-of-ride stop at The Mayor of Old Town
- Dinner at Beau Jo's Pizza, Old Town Fort Collins

### Thursday, Sept. 10- Day 4 Ride

Masonville, Stove Prairie, Rist Canyon – 50 miles, 4,300 feet ascent/descent

- Aid station at Stove Prairie School
- Last 18 miles are downhill all the way to downtown Fort Collins
- End-of-ride stop at the Drunken Monkey
- Dinner at Rio Grande Restaurant

Friday, Sept. 11— Departure date for those with four-night stay
