The meeting will be held on January 27, 2016 from 5:00 - 7:00pm as the Sneads Ferry Community Center in Sneads Ferry. There will not be a formal presentation, but Marine Corps representatives will be available to answer your questions.

ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING

NCFA will host its annual membership Monday, Jan. 25 from 3-5 p.m. at the Riverfront Convention Center in New Bern. This is the meeting where the members elect the Board of Directors and help set the agenda for NCFA for the upcoming year.

The agenda will include the election of Board members and a discussion of some very important issues facing commercial fishermen in 2016 including the latest on the southern flounder situation and the Marine Fisheries Commission's role in the definition of a commercial fisherman.

Prior to the membership meeting the Marine Fisheries Commission's Shrimp Bycatch Reduction Industry Work Group will meet from 10 a.m.-2 p.m. At this workshop, the group will learn about 2015 testing of bycatch reduction gear technologies; prioritize new gears or broad technological solutions for field testing; and recommend what percentage of shrimp loss is acceptable with new bycatch reduction devices.

The Southern Shrimp Alliance will also host a brief meeting to update the industry on anti-dumping duties and how to keep them in place to protect our domestic fishermen.

PROPOSED BOUNDARY EXPANSION TO MONITOR NATIONAL MARINE SANCTUARY

After several years of scientific and archaeological assessment and in coordination with the public, NOAA is proposing to expand Monitor National Marine Sanctuary off North Carolina's Outer Banks to include additional maritime heritage resources. The proposed expansion would protect a nationally significant collection of shipwrecks that currently have little or no legal protection, including one of America's only World War II battlefields.

FEDERAL FISHERY MANAGERS SOLICIT PUBLIC INPUT ON PROPOSED ELECTRONIC REPORTING REQUIREMENTS FOR CHARTERBOATS AND PROPOSED MEASURES FOR HOGFISH, MUTTON SNAPPER AND KING MACKEREL

The South Atlantic Fishery Management Council is soliciting public input through a series of public hearings on proposed measures that could affect federally permitted charter ("6-pack") vessels along the Atlantic coast. For-hire vessels (charter and headboats) operating more than three miles offshore in federal waters must have specific federal permits to legally target dolphin and wahoo, Coastal Migratory Pelagics (mackerel and cobia), and snapper grouper species. The Council is considering alternatives that would require electronic reporting for charter vessels with those federal permits, ranging from weekly reporting to daily reporting, through development of the Atlantic Generic Charterboat/Headboat Reporting Amendment. MFC SEEKS ADVISERS FOR NORTHERN REGIONAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The N.C. Marine Fisheries Commission is still looking for commercial and recreational fishermen and scientists to serve on the Northern Regional Advisory Committee.

The committee advises the commission on various fisheries issue referred to it by the commission, such as draft fishery management plans, and recommends management strategies. The committee may also bring issues pertaining to the region or subject matter to the commission's attention.

The Marine Fisheries Commission chairman appoints members to the committee for three-year terms.

To be qualified to serve on a committee, applicants may not have had a significant fisheries violation within the past three years.

Individuals interested in serving as an adviser should be willing to attend meetings at least once every two months and actively participate in the committee process, which includes reviewing scientific documents and papers summarizing issues to make recommendations on management strategies. Advisers will be reimbursed for travel and other expenses incurred in relation to their official duties.
