UPCOMING NCFA BOARD MEETING

The Board of Directors will meet 2 p.m. Monday at the N.C. Estuarium located at 223 E Water St. in Washington. The board will discuss the proposed supplement to the Southern Flounder Fishery Management Plan and other important issues.

SUMMER FLOUNDER OPENING

The next summer flounder window will be open April 27-Sept. 30 with a 75 box limit and 100 pound black sea bass allowance, per conversation with Louis Daniel. The official proclamation will be issued next week.

JERRY'S LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Things were much busier in Raleigh this week as the crossover deadline is coming up on April 30. If bills that do not pass either the House or the Senate by that date, they die. Of course, there is still the opportunity to provide amendments to existing bills or see something during the budget deliberations, so one still must remain vigilant.

On Thursday, NCFA Board Member Terry Pratt and I attended the Rules Review Commission meeting as their agenda included several regulatory issues by the Marine Fisheries Commission. We'll have an update on that meeting in next week's report.

Next Tuesday, H-302 "Strengthen Oyster Industry" will be taken up by the House Agriculture Committee.

There are times when a committee will take up a bill at the last moment, especially when the legislators are facing an important deadline.

MAFMC TAKES ACTION TO MANAGE BLUELINE TILEFISH

The Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council voted Wednesday to move forward with development of measures for the long-term management of blueline tilefish in the Mid-Atlantic. The council will consider several approaches, including creation of a new fishery management plan and development of an amendment to add blueline tilefish to the existing golden tilefish plan.
