## NET BAN; HB-1122; LIMIT MARINE NET FISHING:

Nothing new to report. The bill remains in the House Rules Committee with the only sponsor being Rep. Billy Richardson.

The Senate continues its work on the budget.

#### FISH STUFF:

There are some discussions going on in the General Assembly about fisheries issues. Typically, the controversial issues are avoided in the short session. It's expected that a series of meetings will be held between the short session and long session that could lead to a revision or complete rewrite of the Fisheries Reform Act. In the meantime, we continue to work with legislators on a few issues for the short session while assuring

nothing negative comes up unexpectedly.
