“Our agencies do not treat Community Innovation Exchanges (CIEs) as conferences for purposes of the conference approval rules set forth in the Deputy Chief Management Officer’s Memorandum dated 06 November 2013. CIEs focus on agency mission requirements; they entail minimal travel expenses (mostly for local mileage); and participants are free to attend or skip sessions, as warranted, instead of committing to an entire slate of activities. While CIEs bear some indicia of a conference, these indicia are outweighed by the attributes described above.”
