A response to Jesus' parable of old and new wineskins and as we are called to put aside old wineskins and create new ones.

Join us April 22 and 24 with Larry L. Rasmussen, author of 2014 Nautilus Book Award winning *Earth-Honoring Faith: Religious Ethics in a New Key* and Reinhold Niebuhr Professor Emeritus of Social Ethics, Union Theological Seminary, New York City. An earlier volume, *EARTH COMMUNITY, EARTH ETHICS* (Maryknoll: Orbis Books, 1996), won the prestigious Grawemeyer Award in Religion of 1997. He served as a member of the Science, Ethics, and Religion Advisory Committee of the AAAS (American Association for the Advancement of Science) and was a recipient of a Henry Luce Fellowship in Theology, 1998-99, the Burnice Fjellman Award for Distinguished Christian Ministries in Higher Education, the Joseph Sittler Award for Outstanding Leadership in Theological Education, and the UNITAS (Distinguished Alumnus) Award from Union Theological Seminary, New York. From 1990-2000 he served as co-moderator of the World Council of Churches unit, Justice, Peace, Creation.
