Our veterinarian diagnosed Pesto with Hepatic Lipidosis, or fatty liver disease. Even though she was considered morbidly obese, she was not eating well. In addition to treating her liver disease, our hospital team supported Pesto with IV fluids and a feeding tube so she could receive regular nutrition. After a few days, Pesto was not responding to treatments and appeared to be declining. Concerned about Pesto's quality of life, our vet wanted to give her one more day. The next morning she brought our directors in to discuss Pesto's condition. While they were talking, Pesto lifted her head up and began to purr!

Within days, Pesto was using her litter box, head-butting and responding to affection! After she fully recovered, we began managing her condition with a special diet and made her available for adoption. She was adopted once, but returned because she was too nervous around the family's children. So, she waited patiently for the right person to come into her life.

"They handed me Pesto's record and I wanted to cry," Whitney shares. "I knew this cat needed a third chance. I called my boyfriend and we never looked back." She says that Pesto's temperament is similar to their other cat, and it was perfect that she is a senior and doesn't overwhelm him like a kitten might. Sure enough, Pesto and 13-year-old Bully are coexisting well - even after she claimed some of his toys as her own. It also seems that being in a loving home has brought out Pesto's frisky, playful side!
