## COUNT ME IN ✓

"Count Me In" is a special mini-stewardship campaign to support the ministry and mission of our church. We are asking you to prayerfully consider making an over and above financial commitment for the next eight months, through June 30, 2016. *If you've never made a regular financial gift to Broadway in the past or you are new to our community, this is a great time to take that first step in giving.*



**Broadway's Community Garden** is a mission to the Columbia community and our members.

(maintaining confidentiality, as is our practice), the difference between projected and actual income corresponds closely to the amount of pledges committed and later withdrawn or giving withheld by a group of Broadway members earlier in the year. In other words, if this group of individuals were not withholding financial support, we would be right on target

with our income projections.

You may be thinking, "Didn't we already have a stewardship campaign earlier in the spring?" Yes, we did, and our congregational leaders put together a plan for ministry for the 2015-16 year, based on our financial commitments and Broadway's historical giving patterns over the past 5 years. After a review of our financial status for the first quarter, through the end of September, our leaders report two things:

- Our spending is on target or below (to date, income is exceeding our expenses), and;
- Our income is below what has been projected for the year, by about \$8,000/month.

Why are we confronted with this shortfall? It is not due to our Board making poor budget decisions. Following a detailed analysis of our first quarter giving

The good news is that our action is timely. We can make up this difference if each of us increase our giving by 10% between now and June 30, 2016, either with a one-time gift or by bumping up our monthly giving for the next eight months. *(continued on page 2)*

They demonstrate the Broadway Spirit by living out the *Eight Keys of Discipleship*: Daily Prayer, Weekly Worship, Regular Bible Study, Participation in a Relational Group, a Life of Service, Practicing Grateful Generosity, Sharing the Faith, and Honoring a Sabbath time.

These are the saints our children will remember and imitate. They are devoted to making Broadway great to the glory of God. And I thank God for them.

# Bringing Our Veterans All the Way Home

## Workshops Offered to Train Mentors for Veterans

How can a veteran be physically at home, but not “all the way home”? The result of moral injury, an unseen injury to a veteran’s moral core, can leave him or her unable to fully integrate into their state-side, “normal” life. Combat experiences have left them feeling displaced and isolated. These veterans may seek relief from their pain with alcohol, drugs or other self-destructive behaviors—including suicide.

For these veterans, the way home will always be a challenge. Two training events are being provided to equip individuals to serve as mentors for veterans struggling with the hidden wounds of war. You may sign up for one or both:

### H.E.R.O.E.S. Care Workshop

This workshop is presented by the H.E.R.O.E.S. organization from St. Louis. This training module has been crafted to compliment Stephen Ministry training, but is applicable to all participants who wish to learn



specific skills for working with the veteran community. For those who are already Stephen Ministers this training certifies them to become part of a national registry through the H.E.R.O.E.S program. But for others it serves as training for mentors of veterans in whatever setting they find themselves.

This workshop is a condensed version of Stephen Ministry training with an eye to special mentoring for veterans. This workshop provides a basic toolkit for walking with veterans in their journey of healing.

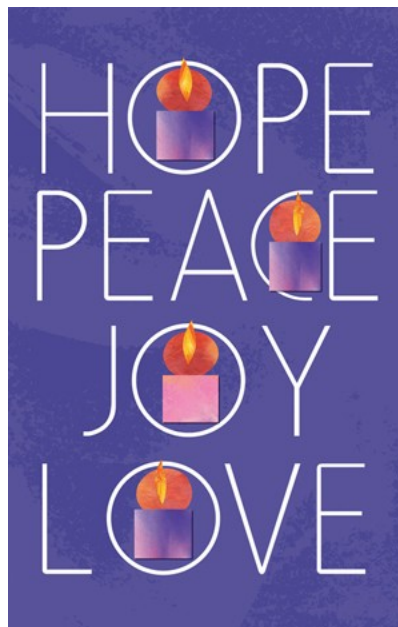


## Can We Include You In Our Advent Preparation?

Room at the Inn emergency winter shelter has begun planning for the 2016 shelter season. Once again, Broadway will offer our facility as a shelter site, beginning January 3 and concluding on the morning of January 31.



The exciting news about this year's shelter planning is that all shelter sites have been confirmed for the entire winter season! Room at the Inn will open on December 20 at Fairview Methodist Church. The schedule for shelter locations is as follows:

- January 3-31—Broadway
- January 31-February 14—Missouri United Methodist
- February 14-21—First Presbyterian Church
- February 21-March 3—First Baptist Church

The Room at the Inn planning team is very pleased to welcome First Presbyterian Church as a shelter site. First Presbyterian has a very active ministry to the homeless, including the Saturday Cafe ministry, which offers a free breakfast and coffee every Saturday. First Presbyterian is one of several downtown churches that host the Cafe on a rotational basis.

The next Room at the Inn planning meeting will be held at Broadway on **Tuesday, November 10, at 6:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall.** Whether you are a new or returning volunteer, you are encouraged to come and hear the latest on Room at the Inn and find your "spot" to volunteer for 2016. 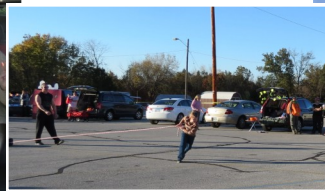

## *KidzWAY Provided A Successful Bridge to Family Worship*

Sometimes a bridge is just a bridge we've already crossed. The KidzWAY area was designed to be a bridge to assist our families to be in worship together. Our Children's Ministry Team feels strongly that we are now on the other side of that bridge, and it is time to move forward together.

KidzWAY was always intended to be a teaching aid/worship tool that would teach children who choose to participate about the elements and movements of corporate worship at Broadway. After 3 years as a program we feel it has done just that. It has accomplished its goal of assisting some of our families in creating a space for children to be children within the context of corporate worship while balancing the need for freedom with an awareness of what is going on in worship.

And yet, our Team believes that KidzWAY has in some ways also evolved into a barrier to the very goal that it was designed to accomplish. The longer it exists as an independent program, the harder it becomes to know the appropriate time to encourage our youngest worshippers to transition out of the program. As a bridge it was always designed with the desire to transition children into being able to sit with their family. This new awareness is largely responsible for our recent decision to change the age requirements of KidzWAY. The area, particularly at 11:15, was overflowing with children that were not following the cues of worship. While programmatically numbers are amazing, it is also clear that parts of the area were also inhibiting our young worshippers from being cued and drawn into the movements of worship at the front of the sanctuary. Since we've made the shift in age, we've witnessed that most of our youngest worshippers are engaged by being present within the family structure. Rather than having a shepherd (who are largely strangers) sit down on the floor with



them, perhaps what is most effective is to see parents or other trusted adults in their lives join them on the floor. I believe our families are ready to embrace this challenge. Our Children's Ministry Team goal remains to engage these children in age appropriate ways to what God is doing in the midst of corporate worship.

So our Children's Ministry Team has decided that will be bringing a close to our guided

KidzWAY area (as of November 1), and instead, open it up as a family designated worship area. You might think of this area as a "casual pews" area where there will remain children friendly aids such as clipboards, coloring sheets, crayons, our movements of worship diagrams, and other aids to assist families in entering into worship together. Our goal with this area is to shift from facilitating children in worship, to a more holistic view of creating space for families to enter into the dynamics of worship together. Our bridge is celebrated and retired.

As a parent of two children under 5, I find moments in worship with them to be extremely fulfilling (and also sometimes frustrating). And yet, I know that those moments where I get to whisper into their ears to watch as Pastor Terry or Pastor Tim lifts the communion cup aloft are moments I want to share with them. I want them to see the value that I place on the depth and experience of elements of worship like Communion, and I want them to see that this isn't just something that we value as a Broadway family but something that impacts us deeply, and is integral to our own faith.

# Highlights From the October Board Meeting

The Board of Broadway Christian Church met for its regularly scheduled meeting on October 27, 2015.

## Information Items

**Appointments:** Board Chair Roger Wilson announced several appointments. Don Lanier will serve as a Deacon for 9:00 a.m. worship. Nancy Welty has agreed to serve as the Financial Secretary.

**Transportation Exploratory Committee:** Marilyn McCreary updated the Board on the committee's progress. The group is talking to church members to assess needs, and investigating all aspects of van or bus ownership, leasing or rental. The committee will continue to update the Board on its progress.

## Ministry Area Reports

**Connections:** Chair Dixie Fisher reported that there have been three bereavement dinners since July, and volunteers are needed for that ministry. She also thanked Broadway and everyone who helped with the October 24 Regional Assembly, which was held at Broadway.

**Worship:** Vicki Keeling-Wallace said that fall decorating is complete, and plans are well underway for Advent and Christmas.

**Service:** Chair Nancy Miller said that Mission and Outreach Ministry has been busy with Wednesday night dinners and other special events. All proceeds from these dinners benefit the adult mission fund. The Tree of Hope will go up on November 22, and VAC Christmas Basket sign-ups and a coat drive are currently underway. MOM sent over 100 health and school kits to the Festival of Sharing, with an additional cash donation.

**Children and Youth:** Shawna Schulte reported that KidzWAY, the bridge activity for young children in worship, will be retired. In Youth Ministry, Stephanie Zaner said that nine middle school students attended YouthFest at the Festival of Sharing.

**Resource:** Property Chair Mike Crews reported that the recent work day was successful. The committee will be looking at making repairs to the parking lots and the office wing roof in the future. Debbie Fisher reported that an investment matured and those proceeds will be used for the Tele-coil Loop project.

## Action Items

**CareLink:** Patsy Dalton and Linda Poehlmann presented a plan to organize existing pastoral ministries (Flower Ministry, Bereavement, etc.) with plans to add additional pastoral care opportunities, such as a "Handy Helper" service, transportation and others. The new structure would provide better tracking of member needs and services provided to members. A motion to adopt the CareLink plan was made by Dixie Fisher and seconded by Vicki Keeling-Wallace. The motion was approved.

**Treasurer's Report and Stewardship Plan:** Martha Head reported that expenses are on or below target levels. However, there is approximately an \$8000 per month shortfall in expected revenues, which over a calendar year, will total over \$100,000. At the Treasurer's request, Church Administrator Ingrid Luckenbill did an analysis of current giving, and found that shortfall was attributable to a group of members who began withholding or withdrawing their pledged giving last spring. In response to the shortfall, Chair Roger Wilson announced a proposal to conduct a short-term, supplemental stewardship campaign. Martha Jolly and Guy Adams will coordinate the November 1-22 campaign. A motion to approve the proposed campaign was made by Nancy Miller and seconded by Sara Miller. After some discussion, the motion passed unanimously.

Following minister's remarks, the Board meeting was adjourned at 8:25 p.m. A copy of Board minutes is available upon request, or may be found on the church website or *Broadway Weekly* e-news.
