Spring Foro in the DR

This past week, April 15-19, I had the pleasure of attending the Spring foro in Santiago, Dominican Republic. It was very encouraging to hear reports from missionaries, local pastors, teachers, and deaconesses about the evangelism being done in Santo Domingo and Pueblo Nuevo, the building projects underway in Licey and Palmar, and the opportunities that await me to preach the gospel there.

What is a foro, you might be asking? The Spanish word for "forum," it is a system of support for LCMS missions in Latin America and the Caribbean.



Lutherans are invited from around the world to sit down and have a conversation with missionaries, learn what is going on in the field, what challenges await, and how everybody can plug in. Those who know the mission field best, of course, are the missionaries themselves. But they depend on a network of people for their expertise in various areas. Regular conversation between missionaries and interested supporters is the objective. We are thankful for Lutherans standing behind missionaries to accomplish Christ's mission.



¡Feliz Pascua!

And as the trees shed their leaves and flowers bloom we are reminded of the new life that God has given us for the sake of Christ who lives. Our risen Christ is the first fruits of those who slept (1 Cor. 15:20). Meanwhile, as we wake and live with the One who loves us, we ask for your continual prayers and generous support of God's work in the Dominican Republic!

The Crucified One Is Risen!

When the women arrived at the tomb on Easter morning, all they wanted was the comfort they would receive from honoring that innocent life that had been swallowed up by death. What they found was death swallowed up by the innocent man, their God and brother. Had the women found what they were looking for they would have remained trapped in death, and we with them. What they found was an empty tomb and the words of a heavenly preacher wearing a white robe. "Do not be alarmed," he said. "You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen. He is not here. See the place where they laid Him" (Mark 16:6).



The angel knew what the women were seeking: the crucified One. They were seeking the One who suffered our guilt, faced our condemnation, and experienced the deep sorrow that our sins brought Him. Have you ever felt remorse? Jesus felt it more. Have you ever experienced guilt? It pierced Jesus more deeply. Jesus was the sin-bearer, and He bore all the sin of all sinners. His innocence confronted our guilt. His righteousness waged war against our sins. His spiritual perfection overwhelmed our spiritual infirmity. It was a life and death struggle, and life won. Martin Luther captures the Easter facts in the following verse:

It was a strange and dreadful strife When Life and Death contended; The victory remained with Life, The reign of Death was ended; Holy Scripture plainly saith That Death is swallowed up by Death, His sting is lost forever. Hallelujah!

Though death may threaten us daily, we do not concede its victory. Its power is undone. When God raised Jesus from the dead, He declared the whole world to be righteous and innocent in His sight. The promise of Easter is the forgiveness of sins. What joy! We now have a life to live! I can't wait to get to the Dominican Republic where by God's grace I will preach this good news with confidence: Jesus, who was crucified, is risen! He is risen indeed!
