

#### **OPENING SESSION AND BREAKFAST**

The Convention officially opens on Wednesday, August 31, at 8:00 am with a welcome breakfast, opening remarks and a keynote speaker to set the tone for three days of learning, engagement and networking.

#### TRACKS AND WORKSHOPS

More than 80 educational sessions are the core of our Annual Convention. Sessions will cover a broad range of agency program and management operation areas. Please note that most of our workshops are 90 minutes in length. We will have some three-hour sessions, which will be clearly marked in our program book.

This year, tracks will highlight topics in the areas of:

- Promising Anti-Poverty Practices
- Strategies to Increase Visibility
- Research, Policy, and Action
- ◆ Performance at the Front Line

A special training module for the Supportive Services for Veteran Families (SSVF) program will be offered, including workshop sessions and a mini-general presentation.
