- Hazardous Waste Drop Off Facility (in partnership with the SR Fire Department)
- Marin Resource Recovery Center (MRRC) solid waste disposal. MRRC has achieved a recovery rate of 70%.
- Food to Energy (F2E) Program (in partnership with Central Marin Sanitation Agency (CMSA)) – food waste from over 250 nearby restaurants and cafeterias collected to generate electricity that powers the wastewater treatment agency.
- Marin Recycling Center Environmental Classroom + Tours (serves 3,000+ per year),
 Education, Buy Back of CA CRV bottles and cans, copper, aluminum and brass pieces,
 Confidential Document Shredding
