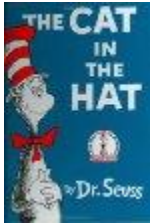

By Robert McCloskey

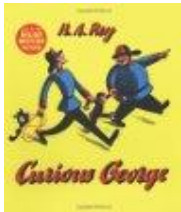
Sal sets off to collect blueberries-some to eat and some to keep-in this children's classic.

By Dr. Seuss

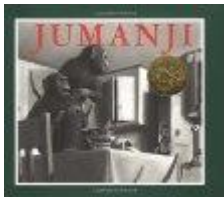
The must-read original from Dr. Seuss proves that there's no such thing as "nothing to do." There are many other good books to read written by Dr. Seuss.

By Hans Augusto Rey

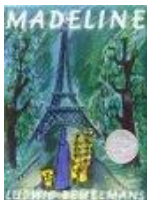
Here's the first of many tales about a curious monkey and the man in the yellow hat.

By Ludwig Bemelmans

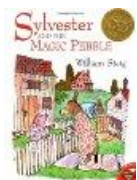
Discover Madeline, her classmates, and the mysterious Miss Clavel.
