



Keynote and Work-

<u>Richard Ruston</u> Richard started out in People First Windsor. He had involvement with People First Canada and is currently People First Ontario President. Richard believes in and promotes the rights of people with intellectual disabilities to make their own decisions, to choose where they live, to have real work for real pay, to have the opportunity for education, and to have enough money to live a life with dignity. Richard is an accomplished speaker and has presented locally, provincially, nationally, and internationally. Richard has received many awards for his work throughout the years, including the Queen's Diamond Jubilee Medal for his contributions to the disability community.

<u>Stephen Kylie</u> Stephen was born and raised in the City of Peterborough, in the Province of Ontario, Canada. He completed a Bachelor of Science degree at Trent University, Peterborough, Ontario in 1975 with a joint major in mathematics and economics. He graduated with a Bachelor of Laws degree from the University of Ottawa in 1978 and was called to the Bar by the Law Society of Upper Canada in 1980. Steve has practised law in Peterborough since his call to the Bar. Stephen is also a Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal recipient.


