Abrazos is about the transformational journey of a group of U.S. citizen children, sons and daughters of undocumented immigrants, who travel from Minnesota to Guatemala to meet their grandparents—and in some instances, their siblings—for the first time. 4.5 million U.S. born children have at least one parent who is undocumented. This is the story of 14 of them.
