Sister Helen Prejean, CSJ, high school teacher, religious

education director, author, international speaker and founder of Survive, began her prison ministry in 1981 after visiting a prisoner with whom she had corresponded. She turned her experiences into the book, *Dead Man Walking: An Eyewitness Account of the* 



Death Penalty which was developed into a major motion picture in 1996. The Death of Innocents: An Eyewitness Account of Wrongful Executions, 2004, tells the story of two men, Dobie Gillis Williams and Joseph O'Dell whom she accompanied to their executions while convinced of their innocence. Founder of Survive, she continues to counsel not only inmates on death row, but also the families of murder victims.


Stephen G. Post, Ph.D., is a researcher and public speak-
