



## Coordinated Hunger Relief Program Community Partner Spotlight

### NATIVE HEALTH

Founded in August 1978, NATIVE HEALTH began as a Community Health Nursing Program and has since expanded to include behavioral health services, the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC), and numerous other health maintenance or preventive services. The agency also provides social programs, including services directed to young parents and their children to assure childhood development, household safety and school readiness.

#### HIGHLIGHTS

- Open **seven days per week** at the Information and Referral Center located in Metro Center Mall at 9617 North Metro Parkway West in Phoenix for assistance enrolling in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) medical insurance coverage, and the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Cash Assistance program.
- **Extended office hours** allow clients to get application assistance as late as 7:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday and 6:00 p.m. on Sundays.
- Participation in a pilot project in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Agriculture and St. Mary's Food Bank Alliance lets Native Health **provide an evening meal to children** utilizing Native Health's programs.
- A **new dental clinic** in Phoenix further expands Native Health's preventive and acute care capacity.
