Tommy obviously sensed that because he placed his head on my forehead in the gentlest way to reassure me that I would be just fine. He can't talk, but I understood him. He was communicating 'Sharnikya, you can do this. I've got your back!' It was a moment I will never forget. Even now, when I am feeling a little bit uneasy about something, I reflect on Tommy's sweet gesture and I am reminded that everything will be just fine."
