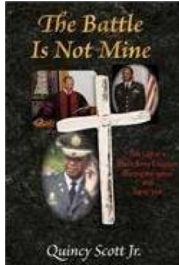


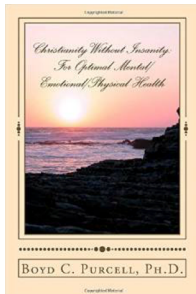

America's Other Clan: The US Supreme Court

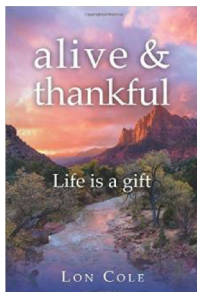

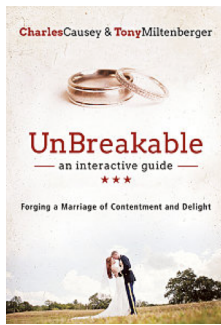
Civil Rights Acts and Amendments.
