## \*\*\*Presenting the Fly\*\*\*

It is caddis season and here is a tip that might pay off for you while fishing the adult caddis dry fly. The adult caddis sometimes lays her eggs by diving in the water, swimming down and depositing her eggs on the bottom of the stream, instead of dropping to the surface of the water and fluttering up and down to lay eggs. Therefore, it is often productive to sink the caddis dry fly (just a quick tug will do it) and emulate the swimming female. Try it, even if there is not a caddis hatch taking place. Black caddis always worked best for me.
