Pat Buhrer introduced today's program: Darcy Crain-Polly is the associate minister at The First Congregational Church of Ann Arbor. She and her family have lived in Ann Arbor since 2008. Darcy leads the single mom's ministry at First Congregational together with her team of volunteers. She is passionate about parenting, children, and the power of community.

The Single Mom's Night meets monthly, on the third Thursday of every month (September - May). The evening offers a healthy dinner with enough leftovers for

moms to have a second meal to take home as well as sepaprogramming for moms and their (ren). Programming for moms has included internet safety training, navigating the holidays (with LCSW therapist leading), pre-K and early elementary activities to do at home, support groups, nights of pampering, legal aid education, and more. Children receive one-on-one homework help and tutoring, mentoring opportunities, and social play in their pre-school room. Christmas gifts are given to the moms and their children each year through a gift program that is made possible by the generosity of church members and friends. Programming (most of it), childcare, and kitchen crews are all provided by volunteers from the membership at First Congregational. The generous donation from Kiwanis provides food and specialized programming fees that allow their program to run as successfully as it has.


