Today's Program...



Guy Marshall and friends

Al Gallup introduced today's program—What Crash Dummies Say by Guy Marshall, General Motors (GM) Senior Anthropomorphic Test Device (ATD) Vehicle Safety and Crashworthiness Engineer. He has worked at GM during the last 25 years and with ATD Vehicle Safety for the last 8 years. Guy provided a very interesting review of over the last 50 years of increased vehicle safety improvements based on testing of crash dummies.

A crash test dummy is a full-scale anthropomorphic test device (ATD) that simulates the dimensions, weight proportions and articulation of the human body, and is usually instrumented to record data about the dynamic behavior of the ATD in simulated vehicle impacts.

As part of today's presentation, Guy shared ATDs, which represented a 6-week-old baby, cost \$9,000 and a 6-year-old child, cost \$90,000. ATDs are currently made in 38 different body types and sizes. The more advanced ATDs may cost up to \$500,000 each.

The data collected include variables such as velocity of impact, crushing force, bending, folding, or torque of the body, and deceleration rates during a collision for use in crash tests. For each physical crash test, over 100 computer simulations are performed. GM uses 170 ATDs here in the US and about 400 worldwide. GM at their Milford test site uses 300 to 400 cars per year. Crash test dummies remain indispensable in the development of increased safety and better ergonomics in all types of vehicles.




