Programs: Secures speakers for noon meetings and arranges for their introductions. (Leslie)

Honorary Members Selection: Nominates worthy community-minded citizens who exemplify the ideals of Kiwanis in their personal and business lives for Honorary Club membership. Oversees the annual induction ceremonies for Honorary Members and Honored Volunteers. (Talcott)

Investment Oversight: Manages the invested reserve funds of the Club's Foundation. (Huck)

Member Recognition: Provides appropriate recognition to members whose contributions have helped the Club achieve its Kiwanis objectives. Oversees attendant award ceremonies. (Cross)

Membership Growth and Education: Develops and implements a strategy for recruiting, orienting and retaining members. (Lande)

Nominating: Nominates willing members to stand for election as Club officers (except Secretary) and Directors. Prepares and counts ballots at the Club's annual meeting. (Goff)

Personnel: Develops, implements and monitors all personnel policies of the Club and Foundation. Position subject to Board approval. (Beeman)

Marketing: Publicizes the activities and programs of the Club and Foundation via various media. (Burg, Vice Chair TBD)

Sale Management Oversight (SMOC): Develops policies and implements procedures for managing all aspects of the Thrift Sale at both locations. (Wishka)

Website: Oversees Club website, posting current information and coordinates with newsletter editors. (Masters & Griswold)

Community Services: Grants funds for a wide variety of community projects. Oversees the Voucher Program, assisting clients and case managers redeem vouchers for Thrift Sale merchandise. (Webb)

Grant Policy: Oversees and administers the Club Foundation's grant application process and facilitates the disbursement of grants. (Dabbs/Burg)

Greater Years: Initiates projects that benefit senior and grand funds to agencies that serve the senior community. (Robinson)

Human and Spiritual Values: Oversees and administers a portion of the Club Foundation's grant funds which center around spiritual values and human comfort. Oversees the Salvation Army Bell Ringing project. Schedules weekly invocation presenters. (Donner)

International Relations: Promotes the development of understanding and friendship among nations and awards grants to agencies that support that objective. (Ando)

Kiwanis of Michigan Foundation: Educates the membership about the role of KMF in serving children who are patients at the 4 hospitals supported by KMF. (French)

K-Family Service Leadership Programs: Fosters the establishment, growth, maintenance and continuation of K-Kids, Builders, Key, Circle K and Aktion Clubs. (Kossick & Tasch)

Meals on Wheels: Delivers meals in conjunction with U of M MOW program to the frail, elderly and disabled, Mon. through Fri. throughout the year. (TBD)

Children and Youth Services: Initiates projects that benefit children and youth from birth to age 18. Grants funds to organizations that serve children and youth, awards college and music scholarships and awards summer camperships. (Burroughs/Dabbs)

Attendance & Reception: Records the names of members who attend the noon meeting. Organizes members to greet other members, guests and visitors as they arrive for noon meetings. Arranges for introduction of guests and visitors to the membership. (Gray & Clewell) **Fines**: Proposes fines and encourages others to do so at noon meetings. Collects fines. (Gallup)

Hospitality: Informs members about births, deaths, illnesses, accidents and hospitalizations that involve current and past members and their families. Sends cards or flowers as appropriate. (Hampton)

Inter-clubs: Encourages exchange visits to other Kiwanis clubs. Ensures that the Club completes at least 2 inter-clubs each month, including all Super-interclubs. (Drake)
