The School of Social Work at the University of Nevada, Reno invites applications for the position of Assistant Professor beginning fall 2016. This is a nine month, tenure track academic position. The School of Social Work offers CSWE accredited BSW and MSW programs. The successful candidate will be expected to engage in research, teach, and to provide service to the profession, university and community. This position is contingent upon funding.

The School of Social Work is part of the University's Division of Health Sciences, and provides extensive opportunities for interprofessional collaborations in teaching and research with faculty at the School of Medicine, School of Nursing, School of Community Health Sciences, Sanford Center for Aging and the Center for the Application of Substance Abuse Technologies. The School currently offers BSW and MSW degrees and has over 350 students from diverse backgrounds attending the program.

The University of Nevada, Reno is the State of Nevada's land grant and historic flagship institution of higher education and is one of eight institutions of higher education governed by the Nevada System of Higher Education. With a growing and increasingly diverse student enrollment of approximately 20,000 including over 2,800 graduate students, the University provides a comprehensive selection of degree programs at the undergraduate, graduate and doctoral levels. The University is currently classified (Carnegie) as "Research University/High" which places us among approximately the top 200 colleges and universities in the United States. Located in the picturesque Truckee Meadows at the base of the Sierra Nevada, the University of Nevada, is located 45 minutes from Lake Tahoe and within four hours from San Francisco and the Napa-Sonoma wine country.

**PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS:** The ideal candidate will possess the ability to teach across the BSW and MSW programs and curriculum. Additionally, the candidate should demonstrate potential to generate external research funding, have a documented ability to work as an effective team member, and present a broad perspective on social work education that transcends geographical borders.
