On March 7 and 8, the U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation Corporate Citizenship Center and United Nations Office for Partnerships will celebrate International Women's Day at the United Nations. This annual forum brings together leaders committed to the economic empowerment of women.

This year's Forum, *The Business of Inclusion: Global Prosperity through Women and Girls Empowerment*, will focus on the tools and tactics that help build inclusive solutions that create opportunities for women and girls around the world. We invite you to come together with more than 500 private and public sector leaders to explore empowerment solutions that bridge opportunity gaps and result in increased economic agency and independence for women and girls around the world.

Event Purpose and Description

- The conference's focus is global with a lens toward the role the private sector has in empowering women.
- With our theme in mind, we are asking speakers to discuss the action on the ground and within your
