This initiative begins with temporary housing for unaccompanied youth, but also includes financial assistance, case management, mentor connections, and employment assistance.

Laramie County residents have responded with mixed results; some have collaborated with the Unaccompanied Students Initiative to support safe housing and educational resources, while others have recognized the need but been nervous about resources allocated within their neighborhoods.

We must unify our response! We all deserve a warm, safe place to be. The unaccompanied youth of Laramie County are worthy of an opportunity to complete their education and pursue their goals beyond high school. As a resident of Laramie County, it is my hope that all youth are able to celebrate Thanksgiving in a safe home, surrounded by people who care for them.
