Teenage Jurors Needed

2014 ORANGE COUNTY PEER COURT

Peer Court is looking for students to attend its summer sessions to serve as volunteer jurors. Student volunteers receive three hours of community service credit for attending a summer Peer Court session.

Peer Court is an innovative juvenile justice diversion program that affords first-time, non-violent juvenile offenders the opportunity to have their cases heard and sanctions recommended by a jury of students ages 13 to 18.

This juvenile diversion program operates under the authority of the Orange County Department of Probation. Superior Court judges preside over Peer Court sessions and select students from the volunteer audience to serve as jurors. Student jurors have the opportunity to question the juvenile offender and his or her parent(s) about the offense, after which they deliberate with the assistance of an attorney advisor and decide upon appropriate sanctions to recommend to the Judge. The Judge issues the final decision and the Probation Department supervises the court-ordered Peer Court sentence.
