Dr. Lynn F. Baynum is an Associate Professor of Reading/Literacy in the Teacher Education Department in the College of Education and Human Services at Shippensburg University of Pennsylvania. She teaches undergraduate and graduate courses in reading and PK4 certification areas. She is the Director of the Center for Faculty Excellence in Scholarship and Teaching: New Faculty Mentorship, which is charged with mentoring new faculty as they navigate their first year as SU faculty. Prior to Shippensburg University, she was a tenured public school teacher in an urban school district with experience teaching elementary students from low socioeconomic backgrounds with English as a second language. Her research interests include: integrating technology in digital composition; incorporating best practice literacy strategies within a gradual release of responsibilities; evaluating teacher prompting to scaffold readers and writers; and teaching young writers.

General Camp Information

Register early: Space is limited to facilitate individual attention.

Four-person suites will be assigned on a first registered, first accommodated basis.

A **certificate of health** must be presented by each participant at the camp's registration. A standard form will be sent upon acceptance. ***This form does not require a physician's examination or signature.***

Health Services: The Etter Health Center is staffed and equipped to take care of minor illnesses and injuries that may arise during your stay on campus. For some emergencies, the staff may send you directly to a local hospital.

Introduction

Virtual Vacations is a thematic camp that engages students in reading comprehension and vocabulary building strategies through digital exploration and composition, specifically as part of an authentic investigation of a destination (Mexico) using Google Earth as a three-dimensional travel guide and iPad apps such as Kahoot, Popplet, Little Story Creator, Wishboard, and QR codes. Virtual Vacations students read electronic texts and websites to explore a country. Students use iPad apps to practice digital composition including comprehension and vocabulary building strategies. Students will create and share their learning experience by posting their informational or persuasive writing on a blog or website.



Content

A Virtual Vacation lesson allows teaches/students to:

- Explore a country and culture via designated online resources
- Participate in a three-dimensional tour of the country using Google Earth
- Use iPad apps to enhance digital composition, comprehension and vocabulary skills
- Create a blog using apps that includes access features such as: topic question, bold and colored terms, and bulleted facts and information to showcase content and literacy learning outcomes

Qualifications

Applicants must be entering grades 2 through 4 in the fall of 2016. You must also provide your own transportation to and from Grace B. Luhrs University Elementary School Library at Shippensburg University.
