- If one lives in Johnson County, a vehicle is needed. Johnson County extends thirty-one miles east to west and twenty nine miles north to south. There's one interstate highway, four state highways, twenty one farm-to-market roads, five spurs, and countless residential streets. These roads are not bicycle friendly. There is no commuter rail, light rail, or local taxi service available. Cletran operates Monday-Friday daytime and the cheapest fee is \$6.00 each way.



- Johnson County borders a Metroplex. Many residents work and go to doctors across the county line. There's a route bus that leaves and returns to Walmart three times a day. However, the bus travels to downtown Fort Worth and riders take the T to their destination. They often don't have the skills or courage to use public transportation.

- Most of the people who submit a request to Cars 4 Christ are on disability or earn minimum wage.
