It's definitely a challenge to balance the time I spend with library related activities and the other volunteer activities I am involved in along with finding time for my family that includes husband Rob and daughter Clare and part-time job. I have been the AFS Volunteer Hosting Coordinator for a three-county area for the last seven years having hosted six AFS international high school students with whom we remain in touch.

I am also very involved with HANDS in Nepal, a local NGO here in Santa Margarita, that builds schools in the most rural regions of Nepal, emphasizing bathroom facilities at each school and promoting the education of girls.
