We are pleased to announce the first musical concert event of the 2015/2016 season Monday, August 31 at 7:00pm: an evening of Mozart for Quintet featuring internationally acclaimed pianist Tatiana Roitman, violinist Kiril Laskarov, and others from the Arkansas Symphony. The season continues with a taping of the NPR broadcast Tales From the South, Four concerts offered by ARMusica (a local ensemble of musicians directed by pianist Julie Cheek), an organ concert by Jason Pennington (premiering two new keyboard works of local composer Dr. Stephen Kemp), a stellar all-piano program by Neil Rutman including works of Debussy and Ravel. This year, St. Luke's was awarded the privilege of hosting one of the Arkansas Symphony Orchestra's "Intimate Neighborhood Concerts", a series of ASO programs for chamber orchestra performed throughout the LR/NLR area in neighborhood churches. Hosting these important concerts is an immense honor for us at St. Luke's and is further an opportunity to bring more and more persons from the community through our Red Doors.
