Ketchum Hosts Celebration for 2016 Art on Fourth Exhibition

Town Square Friday, July 8, 4:30-6:00 pm

KETCHUM, Idaho — The city of Ketchum will celebrate its eighth annual outdoor sculpture exhibition, Art on Fourth, during this summer's July Gallery Walk. The event will take place Friday, July 8, at Town Square from 4:30 to 6:00 p.m.

Members of the city of Ketchum Arts Commission will be on hand to share more information on the artists and sculptures, as well as the commission's other public art initiatives. Complimentary beer will be provided.

This year, the Ketchum Arts Commission selected five sculptures in a juried process to be installed along Fourth Street. The artists, all from Idaho, received an honorarium of \$1,000. They include:

- *Torrent*, by Will Robinson. An abstract black granite monument in Town Square.
- *Stacks*, by Robert Kantor. A steel stack creation in Town Square.
- *Colorish Horse*, by Jacob Novinger. Colorful steel horse on Fourth Street between East and Walnut avenues.
- *Freedom in the Wings*, by Gary Mode. A 6-foot steel eagle on Fourth Street between Main Street and Leadville Avenue.
- *Dancing Maidens*, by Teresa McHugh. A 10-foot steel creation depicting leaves of the Ginkgo biloba tree on Fourth Street between Main and Washington streets.

Brochures with more detailed information on Art on Fourth and the city of Ketchum Arts Commission's other projects will be available at the celebration. The sculptures will be on view through the fall.

About Ketchum Arts Commission

The city of Ketchum Arts Commission was created in 2007 with the objective of integrating arts and culture into the community. Among its initiatives are Cover Art, the wrapping of utility boxes in downtown Ketchum and a ski gondola at the Sun Valley Resort; Art on Fourth, an annual sculpture exhibit; StreetArt, which features manhole covers designed by local artists; a rotating exhibit of work by local artists in City Hall; a significant collaboration with the Sun Valley Center for the Arts to commission two major sculptures as part of The Center's Craters of the Moon project; and the development of policies and plans for public art in the community. The commission consists of local volunteers who are active in and passionate about the arts.

The city of Ketchum is located in the Wood River Valley in south central Idaho. Founded in 1880 during the mining boom, Ketchum is now regarded as one of the most popular destinations for winter and summer visitors due to its world-class skiing, mountain biking, fishing, hiking, restaurants, art galleries and shopping.
