## Land, Water, Food and Energy Panel Discussion

Global resilience is the new sustainability. As the Beaver Creek Fire showed all too well, the Wood River Valley faces great risks from economic and environmental disruptions, so greater resilience is urgent.

On Thursday, April 23, at 6 pm at the Community Library in Ketchum, a panel of local experts from the Sun Valley Institute for Resilience (SVIR), Local Food Alliance, and Idaho Conservation League (ICL) will discuss how we can turn these risks into opportunities, improving the valley's economy and quality of life.
